Neurological rehabilitation is a dynamic process in which individuals are supported by our expert multidisciplinary teams to maximise physical, cognitive, psychological, social and vocational functioning following brain injury, therefore; enabling them to reach their full potential to return to an active, productive lifestyle and embrace their “new normal”.

We believe a person-centred, evidence-based and integrated approach to providing services is fundamental to delivering high quality care, which must be guided by the patient’s needs and goals.

Our multi-disciplinary teams will collaborate with the service user and their family/care giver to develop a bespoke care plan, which will focus on improving cognitive functioning, optimising physical health and maximising

functional independence through functional retraining and developing compensating strategies.

We also seek to enhance mental wellbeing, which includes elements that are key to optimum functioning and independence, such as life satisfaction, optimism, self-esteem, feeling in control, having a purpose in life and a sense of belonging, which improve quality of life.

The Oakleaf Group has developed its care pathway recognising that each person’s journey to recovery is very different and highly personal.

Individuals can access our care pathway at any point, move through the pathway as they develop coping strategies, resilience and independence or discharge having only required one element.

Both quality of life and quality of care are equally valued in the work we do.

Our Team

Rehabilitation is provided by a team of highly skilled healthcare professionals:-

Our therapists have extensive access to our on-site OT training kitchens, well equipped physio therapy gyms and transitional flats which enable us to risk assess in an environment that replicates home. Intervention delivered via assistive technology can be used to restore function, to enable individuals to participate in activities that they were able to before their injury.





Specialist Stroke Rehabilitation

Our stroke recovery programme is suitable in instances where there is a reasonable expectation of measurable improvements that will be of practical value to the individual, within a predictable period of time.

As per NICE guidelines; individuals who have the ability to participate [and where functional goals can be achieved] will receive a minimum 45 minutes of each relevant stroke rehabilitation therapy for a minimum of 5 days per week. If more rehabilitation is needed at a later stage, we will tailor the intensity to the person's needs at that time.

Residents will have access to a fully functioning on site gym, transport to facilitate access the community, a full, in-house multidisciplinary team and a broad range of vocational and occupational opportunities.

High Dependency /Specialist Nursing

Our rehabilitation focused, high dependency or specialist nursing services care for individuals who require more intensive observations and interventions or specialist equipment resources.

Our skilled nursing teams are trained to care for individuals with a range of diverse needs, including the management of respiratory problems requiring tracheostomy care and percutaneous endoscopic gastrostomy (PEG) or dysphagia feeding regimes.

Residents have typically completed a period of active rehabilitation and reached the point where the focus is around maintaining independence and function and maximising quality of life.

We are able to support individuals who require a positive behaviour support plan to enable them benefit from their individualised care plan.

Active Rehabilitation

Individuals requiring active rehabilitation will present with a diverse range of physical, cognitive, psychological, behavioural or communicative support needs and require significant input from a full multidisciplinary team.

The frequency and intensity of therapy depends on the complexity of the individual and their ability to engage, as fatigue can be a common barrier to intensive rehabilitation.

Post-Acute Rehabilitation

Post-acute rehabilitation is suitable for individuals who have received a period of active rehabilitation and demonstrated the ability to gain further independence and functionality (sometimes referred to as slow stream rehabilitation). Patients are still progressing but not making rapid functional gains.

Our community services support individuals who are unable to live independently, or require further support to build on existing skills to increase self-reliance.

Community Services

Having suitable accommodation that provides a stable and supportive environment when transitioning into the community, is integral to a persons continued recovery. It also creates an opportunity to consolidate skills, identify areas that require more work and risk assess in an environment that replicates home or supported living.

Our community services support individuals who are unable to live independently, or require further support to build on existing skills prior to living independently. These services are located in the communities of Weston Favell and Hunsbury (Northamptonshire) and Bognor Regis (West Sussex) and

offer a gateway to an abundance of vocational, educational and recreational opportunities.

Our experienced care teams encourage users of the service to set their own goals and objectives and work towards achieving them at a pace they are comfortable with, hence; allowing them to gain some autonomy over the care and support they receive. Support is tailored to meet the needs of each individual and will be adapted as they develop resilience, coping strategies, confidence and self-reliance.

Palliative and End of Life Care

Our care plans are proactive and person centred, with the preferences, spiritual beliefs

and cultural expectations of the service user and their families valued and respected. Maintaining dignity, choice and independence underpins our core values and is at the centre of every interaction.

Our nursing teams will continue to undertake comprehensive assessments and adapt care and treatment plans to reflect changing physical, mental health and emotional needs. Ongoing management of pain and other distressing symptoms is essential in keeping people as comfortable as possible.

Respite Care

Respite care can be booked in weekly blocks for a minimum of two weeks and is available in our specialist nursing or community services.





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
